- 1. What stood out to you from this week's message? Why?
- Read Luke 10:25-37. The expert in the Law answered Jesus' question correctly, but then sought to justify himself afterwards. How do you think he responded to Jesus' story?
- 3. The initial question is about eternal life. How does the parable address the question, and what does it teach us about the nature of true compassion?
- 4. How does Jesus redefine the concept of neighbor through the parable, and how does this challenge our own understanding of who we are called to love and serve?
- 5. Consider the characters in the parable: the wounded man, the priest, the Levite, and the Samaritan. How do their actions reflect different attitudes toward compassion, and what can we learn from each of them?
- 6. Read James 2:14-16. Faith is not just a statement of belief; it is faithfulness to the ways of God. Serving and loving others is integral to who Jesus is. How does this passage give us a glimpse into what is most important?
- 7. How does the passage in James and the story in Luke inform the principle of loving others? How does it speak to what following Jesus should look like?
- 8. When you think of small acts of love and kindness, what things tend to come most naturally to you? Or to whom is it often easiest?
- 9. What tends to be most difficult? Or to whom do you find it most difficult to show small acts of love and kindness?
- 10. From this week's message, what step do you plan to take?
