- 2. Have you ever had a dream fulfilled that didn't live up to the hype or hope?
- 3. Read Matthew 1:18-25. What do you think might have been going through Joseph's mind after his dream?
- 4. Joseph likely had one set of dreams for his family. How do you think the dream God gave him differed?
- 5. Do you think God's dream for you would be easier, harder or just different? Why?
- 6. Read John 15:5-17. How does this passage relate to the dreams or desires in your heart?
- 7. When you consider your dreams (hopes or desires), why does Jesus in John 15 consider "remaining" in God so important?
- 8. What have you found to be helpful when trying to discern whether your dream is a self-directed or God-directed?
- 9. Identify one or two principles in John 15:5-17 that could help you determine which dreams are self- vs God-directed. What are they and how do they help?
- 10. Is there a dream you are holding on to right now that you need to see through the lens of this week's message and John 15:5-17?
- 11. What are your hopes and dreams for 2022?
- 12. How might your dreams change if you surrendered them to God's principles?
- 13. "It's only a dream until you write it down". Take a moment to write down your dream. Offer that dream to God, asking him to bring about his best plan for you in 2022.
